We celebrated the many successful programs and activities that we have had as a church so far in 2016; the church has been busy! We have also made a huge dent in our deficit for this year. We have a ways to go, but we are making wonderful progress.

Looking ahead, we will celebrate the confirming of faith of three of our young people in an Affirmation of Baptism service on June 5.

In this service we will be recognizing the spiritual journeys of London Brazal, Katie Nikolov and Evan Selger as they transition from Church School to being recognized as adults, responsible for their own faith journeys in our church. They will be invited to join our church as full members this fall.

We also will be sending off our Seeds of Hope participants on their mission trip to the Pine Ridge Lakota reservation, working with the Re-Member organization from June 19 until June 25. We will be commissioning them to their work on Sunday, June 12.

Finally, through the work of our music director search committee the search for a new music director is well underway. Two of our finalists will be holding rehearsals with the senior choir and then directing the choir during worship on the Sundays of June 5 and 12. We look forward to these opportunities. It is expected that we will have a new music director in place by September.

Thank you to those that turned out for our clean up day at the church on May 21st. Many hands make light work.

Thank you for the donation and dedication of the new robes for our Senior and Bell choirs.

Thank you to the attendees and presenters at our May 22nd State of the Church meeting.

For those unable to attend the State of the Church meeting, some high points:

In January we had a \$17,000 plus deficit budget: We have since had extra pledges of \$2000 An Easter offering near \$6000 Reduced expenses from the Music Director position of \$3000 Seeds of Hope give back of \$1000

Net deficit at May 22 is about \$5,700; real progress but a ways to go still.

The Endowment has grown 2.69% through April 30, 2016. We still anticipate using 8% of the endowment by year end.

Aside from the Finances:

The Lenten Hunger series had new people in the church and resulted in a community dinner to help folks in our community.

The Yarners group continues to do good works and energize the attendees twice a month.

Financial Peace University, a nine week program, has brought 12 families together, many from outside our church family. Taste of East Hampton brought over 250 community members into our church as a fundraiser for Seeds of Hope, with another 45 participating in our first annual 5K road race.

What we need now is full participation in our summer fundraisers, bringing neighbors, friends and families to help support our church. These include the Spring Sale, Old Home Days Silent Auction and hot dog booth, our August 16th Belltown Open golf outing and the Fall Festival.

PLUS...June 18th, fourteen of us will be headed to Pine Ridge reservation in South Dakota for this year's Seeds of Hope outreach.

(Direct debit from your checking or savings account)

Electronic Giving is a convenient way to provide consistent financial support to our church.

Open your heart without opening your checkbook

Electronic Giving is the term used to describe automatic methods for making contributions on a regular basis without the need to write checks, carry cash or prepare envelopes.

Frequently Asked Questions About Direct Debit Giving

Q. What are the major advantages of electronic giving by direct debit?

A. Direct debit is all about convenience for you and consistency for the church. Electronic giving eliminates frequent check writing and helps members stay on track with pledges even when they are unable to attend services. The church in turn benefits from much-needed donation consistency and a reduction in the volume of check and cash contributions that must be handled and manually processed in the church office.

Q. How does Direct Debit Giving work?

A. Contributions are transferred automatically from your checking or savings account to the church's bank account.

Q. How are my automatic contributions deducted and transferred?

A. First, you sign and return an authorization form to the church indicating the amount you wish to contribute on a regular basis. Contributions are then transferred through the Automated Clearing House (ACH) network—the same network already used by families to make mortgage and utility payments or to receive payroll earnings and Social Security income. Direct debit goes by other names including Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT), automatic payment, or simply, ACH.

Q. When will my contribution be debited from my account?

A. A debit to your account will occur each month on the date you specify on your authorization form.

Q. How will I keep track of contributions in my check register?

A. Since your contribution is made at a pre-established time, you simply record it in your check register on the appropriate date. Electronic contributions will appear on your bank statement.

Q. What can I use to prove I made a contribution?

A. Your bank statement will show an itemized list of electronic transactions that can be used as proof of your contributions.

Q. Is giving by direct debit risky?

A. It is certainly less risky than writing checks or carrying cash to church. To process electronic donations, the church uses Vanco Services, LLC—an established and highly-regarded company that moves funds directly from church members to the church on the same day without any delay. Vanco processes contributions for more than 10,000 churches and nonprofit organizations.

Q. How much does direct debit giving cost?

A. It costs you nothing and it costs the church very little. It is the lowest cost method of transferring funds.

Q. What if I try electronic giving by direct debit and don't like it?

A. You can cancel your authorization at any time by notifying the church.

Q. How can I sign up for electronic giving by direct debit?

A. Complete, sign and return the authorization form on the following page to the church office.






What you need:

- White construction paper (11" x 13" sheet)
- Pencil
- Black permanent marker
- Crayons or paint

What you do:

- In the center of the paper, trace your foot in pencil.
 Darken the outline with marker.
- 2. Color or paint the footprint. Let it dry.
- 3. Trace your father's foot (same one) on top of your footprint (with yours in the middle of his).
- 4. Color or paint his footprint. Let it dry.
- 5. Sign your names and the date at the bottom.
